## Deacon's Roundtable

As we wrap up our stewardship program I felt the following scripture lesson was very appropriate. [Please read Luke 12:13-21]

Jesus was not about to get pulled into this family dispute. Jesus redirected him by telling a parable that encouraged him to make himself rich not in possessions but in "what matters to God."

The parable relates that the landowner is called a fool, not because he is wealthy, but because he stockpiled his wealth. He was concerned only for his own comfort and security. He ignored the needs of the people around him. His attitude stands in stark contrast to God's compassion for the poor and suffering.

Things for this man could have been different if he had followed the ancient Jewish tradition to leave gleanings at the edges of his fields for his poorer neighbors instead of reaping every single grain.

We might be tempted to chuckle about this man until we realize that we too have been blessed with a bountiful harvest. Regardless of the amount of material resources we possess, each of us has God-given gifts. Each of us has been given the gift of faith; we have unique talents and loving relationships. These are the gifts we can share with the people around us, instead of keeping them to ourselves.

As we approach Advent this year the "Giving Tree" will again be set up in the sanctuary as has been our tradition for many years. See an article further on in this newsletter from Retta concerning this tradition.

Let us share those good things that God has given us. Let's use them generously to lift people up. That is the best way to become rich in what matters to God. Let us pray for the Lord to help us to be rich in compassion and mercy.

Capital Campaign Update
Fellowship Room Lift/Bathroom Project

UNDER CONSTRUCTION

Over the next couple of months, you will be seeing signs that the construction of the new hydraulic lift and ADA bathroom in the Fellowship Room are well underway. Collie Construction ("Collie"), located nearby on Bridge Street, is the primary contractor that was selected for completing the project which will include a new floor for the Fellowship Room as well as continuing to address the ongoing water issues that periodically affect the Fellowship Room. The lift has been ordered from the lift manufacturer, Garaventa, and is anticipated to be delivered to the church the last week of November. In preparation for installing the lift, Collie has completed installing a 4 ft. x 4 ft. x 16" thick concrete footer in the Fellowship Room during the week of October 14. Collie will next be working on framing out the area for both the lift and the new ADA bathroom. This portion of the work will also include opening up the entire length of the lower wall along one side of the Fellowship Room. Thank you for your patience as work on the project continues. Look for periodic updates as work continues on the project. If you have any questions, please contact Mark Hammaker.
